I was born in Springfield, Massachusetts in 1942. In 1949 I moved to Lincoln, Massachusetts and graduated from Lincoln-Sudbury High School in 1960. I was appointed as an On Call Firefighter for the Town of Lincoln from 1960 through 1978.

I furthered my education at Wentworth Institute, Boston, MA. I graduated in 1962, receiving a Junior College certificate and an FAA Aircraft Mechanics License.

I enlisted in the United States Air Force in 1964 through 1968. I received an Honorable discharge as an E-4, Munitions Specialist after serving in Europe and Philippines. (Clark Airbase)

I began my career in Law Enforcement in 1970, being appointed an officer for the Town of Lincoln Police Dept. I attended and graduated from the Mass. State Police Academy in August of 1970. During my time in Lincoln, I served as a Patrol Officer, Detective and District Court Police Prosecutor for the Town of Lincoln until 1978.

I continued my education and received a Bachelor of Science degree in Law Enforcement from Northeastern University, Boston Ma. in 1978.

In 1978 I accepted a position with the Boston and Maine Railroad Police, serving as a Special Agent, Lieutenant, Captain and Chief of Police. I was in command of thirty Officers located in all six New England States, with a budget of approximately 1.3 million dollars. I resigned as Chief of Police after a new company purchased the railroad in 1988.

I also served as an On Call Firefighter, EMT for the Town of Littleton, MA from 1982 to 1992.

I accepted a position as a Police Officer for the Town of Littleton Police Department in 1988. I was assigned as a Detective and Police Prosecutor and served in that capacity till my retirement in 2002.

Through the years I have attended numerous continuing education courses through the Mass. Criminal Training Council.
